knowledge that you can share with us?

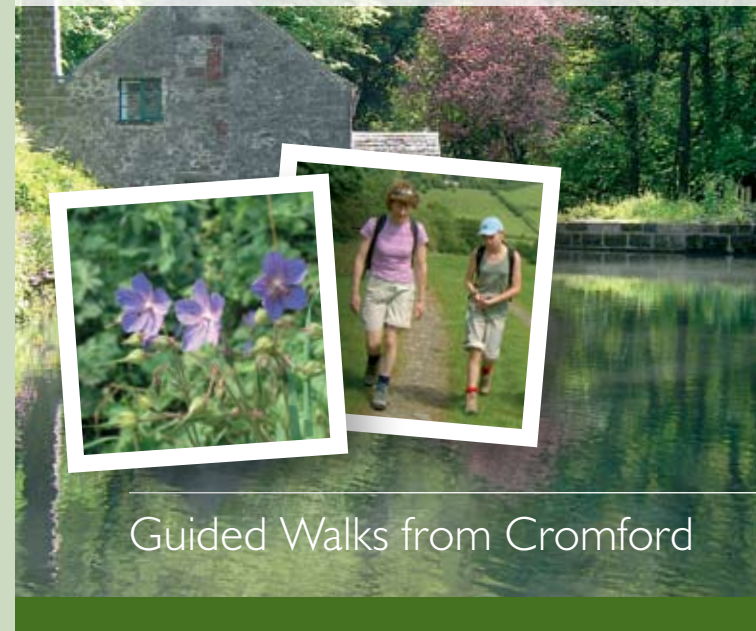
If so, why not join our Slinter Committee which meets every two months for a couple of hours? Just ring Vikki on 01629 823256 and she will tell you about our next meeting.

The effects of our woodland and meadow management.



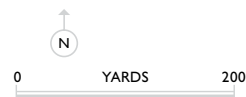
Dunsley Meadows Local Nature Reserve old hay meadows, gradually being restored by controlled grazing.
